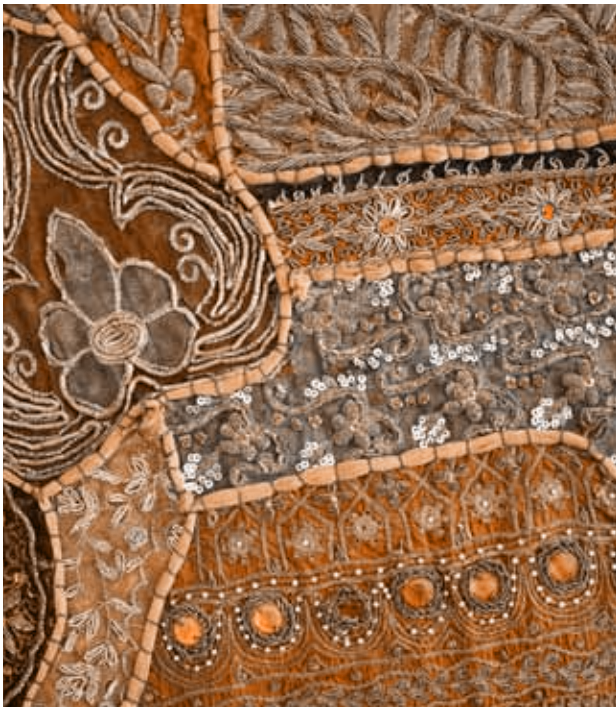


TRADE & INDUSTRY IN ASIA PACIFIC: HISTORY, TRENDS & PROSPECTS
