Henry Dexter sent the manuscript to R W Robson, Editor of the *Pacific Islands Monthly*, in February 1939, saying that it had not been accepted by another publisher. Evidently Robson did not accept the manuscript for publication and it was eventually passed on to Robert Langdon.
